WHAT'S HAPPENING ON SITE...

Following Liverpool's final home game of the season, work has continued on the expansion of the Main Stand.

A 650-tonne crawler crane, is currently on site and has started to assemble the steel truss which will support the expanded stand's new roof - after the first piece arrived on site at Anfield last month

The truss is being delivered to site in large sections and is being assembled on the Main Stand's new podium level. When the two-storey podium level is completed it will provide access for fans entering the central section of the stadium.

The two storey 1970s structure which formed part of the existing Stand has been demolished in preparation for the new and existing structures to be connected.

Ongoing work at Anfield will mean that a temporary hospitality facility will be in use on a matchday during the 2015/16 season.

LFC is currently erecting a temporary marquee which will be located within the expansion site, close to Walton Breck Road. Work will be completed during this close season.

LARGE CRANES AT ANFIELD...

Anfield is set to become home to the UK's largest cranes, as work to expand the Main Stand prepares to reach an important milestone.

The cranes will arrive on site to lift the Stadium's new 650 tonne steel truss above from its temporary position on the podium and up and over the new structure. The truss will be fixed at each end to two tall columns at either end of the Main Stand.

The two 1200 tonne cranes will be visible in the City's skyline and will work in tandem to complete the lift, one of the most complex parts of the build programme.

The size of the cranes will mean that a large number of vehicles will be required to deliver them the site where they will be assembled over the next few days.

Each delivery vehicle will use a route that has been planned in partnership with Liverpool City Council Highways Department, to ensure disruption to local residents is kept to a minimum.

Local residents can expect to see the truss being lifted above the Main Stand from several points around North Liverpool. Anfield's Museum, Bootroom Cafe, Ticket Office and Retail store will remain closed the day the Truss is lifted into position.

LOCAL APPRENTICE EVENT.....

Carillion recently hosted an apprentice awareness event to help provide young with a chance to meet with local employers and find out about apprentice opportunities that are currently available.

At the session, held at the Liner Hotel, local people were able to find out more about starting a career in the construction industry as well as available opportunities on the Anfield's Main Stand and the new Royal Liverpool Hospital.

More than 100 young people attended the event, which was also supported by the Carillion Training Services Centre (CTS) and Liverpool in Work, Liverpool City Council's recruitment service.

The CTS team were on hand to provide advice on an apprenticeship as a pathway to a career in construction and also to provide support for people interested in an apprenticeship at the Bootle based training centre.
